The product has a fixed term and will be due on 23 December 2030, subject to an early redemption.

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) regular fixed coupon payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of this payment will depend on the performance of the **underlyings**. If, at any time during the **barrier observation period**, any of the **underlyings** has fallen below 49.00% of its **initial reference level**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

Early termination following an autocall: The product will terminate prior to the maturity date if, on any autocall observation date, the reference level of the worst performing underlying is at or above the relevant autocall barrier level. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following autocall payment date receive, in addition to a final coupon payment, a cash payment equal to the autocall payment of CZK 10,000. No coupon payments will be made on any date after such autocall payment date. The relevant dates and autocall barrier levels are shown in the table(s) below.

Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the maturity date you will receive:

- if the final reference level of the worst performing underlying is at or above 80.00% of its initial reference level, regardless of whether a barrier event has occurred, a cash payment equal to CZK 10.000;
- 2. if the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is below 80.00% of its **initial reference level** and a **barrier event** has not occurred, a cash payment equal to CZK 10,000; or
- 3. if the final reference level of the worst performing underlying is below 80.00% of its initial reference level and a barrier event has occurred, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the worst performing underlying. The cash payment will equal (i) the product notional amount multiplied by (ii) (A) the final reference level of the worst performing underlying divided by (B) its initial reference level.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlyings**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

# Intended retail investor

The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who fulfil all of the criteria below:

- they have advanced knowledge and a comprehensive understanding of the product, its market and its specific risks and rewards,
  with relevant financial industry experience including either frequent trading or large holdings in products of a similar nature, risk and
  complexity, either independently or through professional advice;
- they seek income and/or capital growth, expect the movement in the underlyings to perform in a way that generates a positive return. They have a medium investment horizon and understand that the product may terminate early;
- they are able to bear a total loss of their initial investment, consistent with the redemption profile of the product at maturity (market risk);
- they accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product irrespective of the redemption profile
  of the product (credit risk);
- 5. they are willing to accept a level of risk of 3 out of 7 to achieve potential returns, which reflects a medium-low risk (as shown in the summary risk indicator below which takes into account both market risk and credit risk).

# 2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

#### **Risk indicator**





The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until 23 December 2030. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk: If the currency of your account is different to the currency of this product, you will be exposed to the risk of suffering a loss as a result of the conversion of the currency of the product into the account currency. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above. Because the product currency is different from the underlying currency, you will be exposed to the risk of suffering a loss if the underlying currency declines in value relative to the product currency.

The favourable, moderate, unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the past performance of the **underlyings** over a period of up to 5 years. In the case of an early redemption, it has been assumed that no reinvestment has occurred. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. This product cannot be easily cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period, you do not have a guarantee and you may have to pay extra costs

# 3. What happens if UBS AG, London Branch is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the issuer might be unable to fulfil its obligations in respect of the product – e.g. in the event of insolvency (inability to pay / over-indebtedness) or an administrative order of resolution measures. In case of a crisis of the issuer such an order can also be issued by a resolution authority in the run-up to an insolvency proceeding. Thereby the resolution authority has extensive intervention powers. ## 5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

### Recommended holding period: 5 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 23 December 2030 (maturity), although the product may terminate early.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. Save as otherwise disclosed in exit costs (see section "4. What are the costs?" above), no fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
